



#### **General Warnings**

## WARNING!

- 1. Do not open or tamper with the CTRL+5<sup>®</sup> enclosure. Tampering could cause the internal circuit to fail.
- 2. Do not tamper with fasteners on the CTRL+5 unless performing routine maintenance.
- 3. Ensure mounting hardware is hand tight.
- 4. Check mounting hardware every month to ensure it is hand tight.
- 5. The wire harness from the CTRL+5 should not be loose or in the way of the seat functions. Ensure that wires are not pinched as the power chair is actuated.
- 6. This product is intended for a single user.
- 7. Always use parts and/or accessories that have been recommended or approved by Sunrise Medical when servicing this chair.
- 8. Never pull on cables. This can result in wires breaking inside the connector or harness. To remove a plug or connector, always grasp the plug or connector itself.
- 9. If a button on the CTRL+5 is accidentally pushed that function will become active.
- 10. Do not reuse any mounting hardware including fasteners.
- 11. Product labeling may fall off due to environment heat, sun exposure, or moisture. Contact your Sunrise Medical authorized dealer for a new label if this occurs.
- 12. Ensure powerchair is off when not in use.
- 13. Ensure powerchair is off when operating a motor vehicle.
- 14. Ensure not to hit, lean on, or hang things from your CTRL+5.
- 15. Do not use your chair in a shower, pool, or other body of water.
- 16. Avoid excess moisture (for example, do not leave your device in a damp bathroom while taking a shower).
- 17. Dry your device immediately if it gets wet or damp, or if you use water to clean it.
- 18. Avoid contact with salt or salty conditions as this may cause damage to the device.

#### Safety: Temperature

#### A WARNING!

- If you do not use the CTRL+5, ensure that it is not exposed to direct sunlight for lengthy periods of time. Certain parts of the CTRL+5, such as the keypad, the cable, and the enclosure can become hot or brittle if they have been exposed to full sunlight for too long. This may cause burns to the skin or render the CTRL+5 inoperable.
- 2. Extended sun exposure can result in product labels becoming discolored, illegible, or falling off.

#### Safety: Electromagnetic radiation

#### **A** CAUTION!

The standard version of your CTRL+5 device has been tested on the applicable requirements with respect to electromagnetic radiation (EMC requirements). In spite of these tests:

### Safety: Assignable controls

## **A** WARNING!

It is possible to assign a function to an input control (buttons, jacks) to your seating system. If controls have been assigned to perform a dual or alternate function, ensure you know what each control operates.

Please contact your Sunrise Medical authorized dealer or the Sunrise Medical technical service department if you do not receive this information. Failure to do so may result in product or property damage and/or injury.

## **A** WARNING!

If power seating controls have been assigned latch functionality, any button on the CTRL+5 can be pressed to stop seating movement initiated through latch functionality. In addition, you can press the on/off button on the chair's control system and that will also stop all power seating movements in case of undesired movement.

## **A** WARNING!

Before using the CTRL+5, ensure that the user is able to successfully press the buttons on the CTRL+5 to stop any undesired power seating movement initiated by latch function or voice activation.

#### Safety: Voice control

## A CAUTION!

Before turning on and using voice recognition ensure that the CTRL+5 is mounted in an accessible location for the user or the attendant to press the buttons or toggles.

#### Safety: Surroundings

## A CAUTION!

Before activating a power seating function, ensure that the power wheelchair is clear of obstacles that may limit or interfere with the power seating movement.

#### **Maintenance Tips**

The wheelchair's lifespan is dependant on it being well maintained. For information concerning specific settings, maintenance, or repair work, please contact your Sunrise Medical authorized dealer.

#### Storage Tips:

# **A** WARNING!

- 1. Store your device in a clean, dry area. If you fail to do so, parts may rust or corrode.
- 2. Before using your device, ensure it is in proper working order.
- 3. If you store the device for more than three months, have it inspected by a Sunrise Medical authorized dealer before use.

#### **Cleaning and disinfecting:**

- 1. The CTRL+5 should be wiped down once per week.
- 2. If a foreign substance is present wipe down with a slightly damp (not wet) cloth.
- 3. Ensure that you dry all parts of the device prior to use.
- 4. Ensure you clean your device regularly. This will help you find loose or worn parts. If you find loose, damaged, or worn parts, replace before use.

## A CAUTION!

Ensure that you dry all parts of the device if it becomes wet or damp, such as when cleaning, or if it is used in a wet or damp environment.

# A CAUTION!

- 1. Do not use solvents, bleaches, abrasives. synthetic detergents, wax polishes, or aerosols.
- 2. Disinfectants may be used in dilution as specified by the manufacturer.
- 3. Ensure surfaces are rinsed with clean water and dried throughly.

#### Hygiene measures when being re-used:

Prior to the wheelchair being re-used, it must be carefully prepared. All surfaces which come into contact with the user must be treated with a disinfection spray.

To do this, you must use a disinfectant as authorised/ recommended in your country, for rapid alcohol-based disinfection for medical products and medical devices, which must be disinfected quickly.

Please be aware of the manufacturer's instructions for the disinfectant you are using.

In general, a complete disinfection cannot be guaranteed on seams. We therefore recommend that you dispose of seat and back slings to avoid micro-bacterial contamination with active agents according to your local infection protection law.

#### **Conditions For Safe Storage**

- Products should be stored in a dry place: at 20 75% Relative Humidity.
- Protect from direct sunlight and dust for long periods.
- Away from direct heat and at a temperature between 5°C (40°F) to 40°C (104°F)
- Position and stack the packaged products according to the "this side up" arrows on the packaging.
- If a package is high and narrow and therefore potentially unstable, ensure it is well secured on the pallet or in the racking, to prevent it from falling down.
- Do not stack anything on top of the packaged products when the "do not stack" mark on the packaging is shown.
- Product should never be stored outside and subject to the elements.

#### System Pre-check

#### Before each use perform the following:

- 1. Ensure powerchair is on and charged.
- 2. Ensure buttons are programmed to the desired intended function.
- 3. To ensure buttons are programmed as intended, press each button to verify functionality.
- 4. Ensure label above keypad matches the functionality of the button.

#### **A. Product Description**

The Switch-It CTRL+5 is a switch box device that plugs into the PG Drives R-Net system and allows for the set up of a maximum of ten different functions in ten discrete buttons (each switch is two buttons). The CTRL+5 switches are pre-programmed from the factory to default values for the actuators on the chairs. The Sunrise Medical patented Assignable Buttons option allows the button assignments to be changed to any of the Assignable Buttons functions to best suit each unique user. The system allows for only one CTRL+5 device on the same power wheelchair

The intended lifetime of this product is 5 years.

#### **B.** Technical Information

- 1. Control Type: Switched/Digital Power Wheelchair. Peripheral Function Control.
- 2. Activation Type: Mechanical switch
- 3. Feedback: Activation of programmed power wheelchair functions (i.e. seat functions).
- 4. Connector Type: R-net cable (male) to power wheelchair data-bus connecting block
- Dimensions: approximately 4.25-in (108 mm) W x 2.5-in (63.5 mm) H x 1.25-in (31.75 mm) D.
- USB port on the CTRL+5 provides up to 2.0 Amps at 5 Volts or 9 Volts. Note: If non-USB-C cell phone cables are to be utilized please use compatible cables, which are specifically suitable for charging.

#### C. Compatibility

- 1. Penny & Giles R-Net Electronics required. Power wheelchair must have assignable buttons feature.
- 2. In order to use the Switch-It Remote Seating app with your powerchair you must have the Remote Seating enabled CTRL+5 (Part Numbers 247375 and 247376) and a complex seating module (CxSM, with software version 5.0 or greater).

#### **D. Key Features**

The user may choose from two different CTRL+5 keypad versions: a flat push button version (Fig. 1), or a toggle version (Fig. 2).

Customizable access - patented Assignable Button (option) technology and programming, with use of the power wheelchair dealer's PC Programmer and dongle, provide the user with direct access to up to 10 different functions.

The CTRL+5 may be mounted in several ways for convenient access to seat function controls:

- 1. Armrest mount (cover picture).
- 2. Seat rail mount mounts similar to seat control in automobiles (Fig. 3).
- 3. Back cane mount for attendant control of powerchair peripherals (Fig. 4).

The CTRL+5 has a built-in USB port for charging or powering peripheral devices (Fig. 5). The current is limited to 2.0 Amps, which is sufficient to charge most smartphones and tablets. The port is also on a pigtail so it can be moved from one side to the other depending on how the user prefers to access it.

The USB-C adapter can be re-positioned so that the access port can be on either the Left or Right side of the CTRL+5. Gently pull downward on the USB-C adapter, once remove rotate 180° and re-insert.











### E. Voice Recognition System


The CTRL+5 is equipped with a voice recognition system that will allow you to operate the buttons via English voice commands.

Default from the factory, the CTRL+5 will have the voice recognition system turned off. See below for how to turn it on.

By speaking "Hello Sunrise" the system will awake and be listening for a command to be spoken.

Note that the lights on the CTRL+5 will scroll for 8 seconds to show the CTRL+5 is waiting for a command.

While the CTRL+5 is listening, speak a request of "Sunrise 1" through "Sunrise 10" to select which button will be activated for the preset amount of time.



The buttons of the CTRL+5 are labeled from 1 to 10 to help identify them appropriately (Fig. 6).

Once activated the button will activate for a pre-determined amount of time as set in programing. Activation times can be adjusted from 6 seconds to 30 seconds in 6 second intervals. See below for details on how to change the time duration and volume.

#### **Change Volume Level**

Hold buttons 1+9+10 for 3 seconds (Fig. 7).

For volume level press button 3 to increase the volume and button 4 to decrease the volume. Each LED will indicate 20%:

# of LED's	Volume Level	# of LED's	Volume Level
No LED's	Mute	3 LED's	60%
1 LED	20%	4 LED's	80%
2 LED's	40%	5 LED's	100%

Note: Cyan LED's will illuminate to let you know you are in the volume setting.

Once appropriate volume is determined, hold buttons 1+9+10 for 3 seconds to return to normal CTRL+5 operation.

#### **Turn On Voice Recognition**


Hold buttons 1+9+10 for 3 seconds (Fig. 7).

Press Button 7 to turn on voice recognition. An LED will illuminate to indicate that voice recognition has been activated, and the activation duration is set to 6 seconds.

Then hold buttons 1+9+10 for 3 seconds to return to normal CTRL+5 operation.

#### **Change Activation Duration**

Hold buttons 1+9+10 for 3 seconds (Fig. 7).



For Activation duration Press Button 7 to increase activation time and button 8 to decrease activation time.

Each LED will indicate 6 seconds of activation time:

# of LED's	Activation Time	# of LED's	Activation Time
No LED's	Activation is off	3 LED's	18 seconds
1 LED	6 seconds	4 LED's	24 seconds
2 LED's	12 seconds	5 LED's	30 seconds

Note: Purple LED's will illuminate to let you know you are in the activation duration setting.

Once appropriate activation time is determined, hold buttons 1+9+10 for 3 seconds to return to normal CTRL+5 operation.

#### **Stop Control**

If at any time while using voice activation commands of the power seating you wish to stop the power seating from moving, just say "Stop" or press any button on the CTRL+5 and the seating will immediately stop moving.

## **A** WARNING!

In the event that the CTRL+5 is listening for voice commands when not desired, just say "Stop" and the CTRL+5 will stop listening.

## A WARNING!

In the event of undesired power seating movement, press any button on the CTRL+5, or say "Stop", and the seating will immediately stop moving. In addition, you can press the on/off button on the chair's control system and that will also stop all power seating movements in case of undesired movement.

#### **External Microphone Socket**

The CTRL+5 is equipped with a 1/8-in (3.5mm) audio socket on its bottom (Fig. 8). This socket is for an external microphone that can improve voice recognition and your overall experience with the CTRL+5.



The external microphone can provide better results in various situations, including, but not limited to, the following:

Low Voice Volume: It helps users whose voices aren't loud enough to consistently activate voice commands.

Ambient or Environmental Noise: It helps overcome difficulties with voice commands when there is a lot of background noise.

Proximity to the CTRL+5: It is useful when the CTRL+5 is located too far from the user or caregiver, or if the distance changes during seating movements.

Using an External Microphone:

- 1. Connect the Microphone: Plug a compatible microphone into the 1/8-in (3.5mm) audio socket located on the bottom of the Ctrl+5.
- 2. Position the Microphone: For optimal performance, position the microphone near the Rider or Caregiver.

Note: When an external microphone is connected, the Ctrl+5's internal microphone will be automatically disabled.

## F. Installation and Programming

Install the CTRL+5 in a location that is easy for the intended user to access. Only a Sunrise Medical authorized dealer should install this product.


### Indicators

The behavior of the indicators is dependent on the seating module in the system.

- 1. With an Intelligent Seating Module (ISM) the indicators (Fig. 9) will all be green, yellow, or red.
  - a. Yellow indicates a drive inhibit is active; green indicates there is no drive inhibit; and red indicates a drive lockout is active.
  - b. When NO LED indicators are illuminated this means the module has not authenticated with the powerchair. To authenticate: turn the power wheelchair power off and then back on to cycle the chair's power.
- 2. With a Complex Seating Module (CxSM) the indicators (Fig. 9) are linked to the button below them.
  - a. When a button is assigned to any other option but seating, the light will be solid white.
  - b. When a button is assigned to a seating Memory axis, and that axis is running, the light will be blinking green.
  - c. When a button is assigned to a seating Memory axis and a drive inhibit occurs, the LED will change to the drive inhibit color once the axis is stopped.
  - d. When a button is assigned to a seating Memory axis other than a Memory axis, the drive inhibit color change will happen when the inhibit happens.
  - e. The LED color will be Red for a lockout drive inhibit.
  - f. When a button is assigned to any seating axis and no actuator channel within that axis has called for a drive inhibit, the LED color will be green.

## **Programming Assignable Buttons**

- 1. Changing the assignable buttons of the CTRL+5 should only be done by a Sunrise Medical authorized dealer.
- 2. Connect powerchair to PC Programmer using a Programming Dongle.
- 3. Read Chair into the programmer by clicking on the blue down arrow in the toolbar, shown at right.
- Open the Switch-It folder and the module you wish to change. Figure 10 shows Button 1 of module 1 is assigned to Profile Up and Profile Down.
- 5. To change this, double click on the current assignment. In this case you would double click on the "Profile Up" text. This brings up the window as shown in Figure 11.
- 6. Now select the function you need that button to do by clicking the checkbox, then click OK.
- 7. Continue this process until all buttons have the desired function.
- 8. Now click the upload button, shown at right.
- 9. Now power cycle the chair. Your new assignments are now updated.

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
#### **Different Configurations Offered**

1. Press the toggle buttons outlined with a red "X" as pictured and the following buttons will be reassigned according to the following tables.

2. To reset the CTRL+5 back to the memory positions that were assigned prior to the above changes, complete the following step:

a. Hold down the two far buttons and then press the top button in the fourth row as shown at right. This will bring back the functionality of the CTRL+5, before the change.



#### G. Troubleshooting

**Issue:** Powerchair hourglass shows on display and does not go away.

## Solution:

- Make sure only one CTRL+5 is connected to the chair. (If second one is present unplug and remove the second CTRL+5.)
- 2. Turn chair off.
- 3. Unplug CTRL+5.
- 4. Turn chair on.
- 5. Hourglass shows on display until switch-off symbol occurs.
- 6. Turn chair off.
- 7. Plug in CTRL+5.
- 8. Power cycle

**Issue:** New button assignments are not loading on the device.

#### Solution:

- 1. Turn chair off.
- 2. Unplug CTRL+5.
- 3. Plug in CTRL+5.
- 4. Power cycle (turn off and turn back on) the chair and retry button assignments to ensure they function as intended.

**Issue:** Control lights stay on when chair is off.

#### Solution:

- 1. Turn chair off.
- 2. Unplug CTRL+5.
- 3. Plug in CTRL+5.
- 4. Turn chair on.

#### H. Warranty

Each Switch-It device is carefully inspected and tested to provide peak performance. Every Switch-It device is covered under a limited, express warranty.

- All **electronic components** are covered under warranty for twelve (12) months from the date of shipment, provided normal use, 1. unless modified or damaged.
- All mounting hardware is covered under warranty for twelve (12) months from the date of shipment, provided normal use, unless 2. modified or damaged
- 3. All wearable items (covers, pads, etc.) are covered under warranty for three (3) months from the date of shipment, provided normal use, unless modified or damaged.

Warranty claims should be processed through the nearest Sunrise Medical authorized dealer. A Return Authorization number must be obtained prior to returning the item for evaluation, along with details of the issue.

Items returned for warranty claim must be evaluated by Switch-It before warranty determination is made. Should a defect in materials or workmanship occur during the warranty period, and the item has not been modified or damaged, Switch-It will, at its option, rework or replace it without charge.


